AN ORDINANCE OF THE WARRENVILLE FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT,  
DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS,

CREATING AND ESTABLISHING A FIREMEN'S PENSION FUND AND Joint Act of DuPage County, Ill.

CREATING A BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF SAID FIREMEN'S PENSION FUND

WHEREAS, the Warrenville Fire Protection District is a "municipality" as defined in Illinois Revised Statutes, Ch. 108-1/2, Sec. 4-103, and

WHEREAS, the said Warrenville Fire Protection District has previously not had any full-time paid fire fighters, and

WHEREAS, the said Warrenville Fire Protection District now has, or will have, one or more full-time paid fire fighters, and

WHEREAS, by reason of Illinois Revised Statutes, Ch. 108-1/2, Sec. 4-103 and 4-101, if the Warrenville Fire Protection District has any full-time paid fire fighters, the Board of Trustees of said Warrenville Fire Protection District shall establish and administer a Firemen's Pension Fund for the benefit of its firemen, and their widows, children and other certain dependents, and

WHEREAS, the Warrenville Fire Protection District is desirous of establishing said Firemen's Pension Fund,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Trustees of the Warrenville Fire Protection District, DuPage County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION ONE

That there is hereby created and established a Firemen's Pension Fund in and for the Warrenville Fire Protection District, DuPage County, Illinois, in accordance with Illinois Revised Statutes, Ch. 108-1/2, Sec. 4-101, et seq.

SECTION TWO

That, for the purposes of this Ordinance, the term "Fireman" or "Firemen" and "Board" or "Board of Trustees" are defined,

respectively, as a full-time fireman or full-time firemen entitled to participate in the benefits of said Pension Fund as provided by Article IV of Illinois Revised Statutes, Ch. 108-1/2, and the Board of Trustees of said Pension Fund.

SECTION THREE

That there shall be set apart by the Fire Protection District, and the Treasurer thereof, beginning as of the 1st day of May, 1982, the following monies to constitute said Firemen's Pension Fund, to wit:

1. All monies derived from the taxes levied for the purposes of the Fund;
2. All fines imposed for the violation of fire ordinances, the enforcement or collection of which may be charged to and be under the supervision of the chief officer or subordinate officers of the Fire Department District;
3. All rewards in monies, gifts and emoluments that may be paid or given to the Fire Protection District for or on account of extraordinary services by the Fire Department, Fire District or any member thereof (except when allowed to be retained by competitive awards);
4. All gifts, grants, devises, or bequests of money, real estate, personal property or other valuable things received by the Board of Trustees of the Pension Fund, which said Board of Trustees shall be empowered to receive and dispose of pursuant to Statute;
5. Seven and three-fourth's per cent (7-3/4%) or such other sum as from time to time required by law of the salary of each full-time fireman of the Warrenville Fire Protection District, which shall be deducted and withheld from each payment of salary of such firemen and placed by the District Treasurer to the credit of the Pension Fund.

SECTION FOUR

There shall be levied annually, commencing with the effective date of this Ordinance, a tax upon all the taxable property of the Warrenville Fire Protection District at the rate on the dollar which will produce an amount to meet the annual requirements of the fund as computed by the Department of Insurance of the State of Illinois. Except as may be otherwise provided by law from time to time, said actuarial reserve requirements shall be computed at a rate of not less than 17.5% of the salaries to be paid to the firemen for the ensuing year, and shall provide for the amortization of the unfunded accrued liabilities, including liabilities on account of pensions and benefits in force.

SECTION FIVE

That a Board of Trustees of the Firemen's Pension Fund of the Warrenville Fire Protection District is hereby created for the administration of said Fund and the members of said Board shall be the President of the Board of Trustees and the other two Trustees of the Warrenville Fire Protection District, and the Chief of such Fire Protection District or Fire Department, together with three other persons who shall be chosen from the active full-time firemen of the District, if any, and one other person who shall be chosen from the firemen thereof who have been retired firemen of said District, if any.

SECTION SIX

That the rights, powers, duties and functions of said Board and the members thereof, as such, and the rights and benefits of the various beneficiaries of the Pension Fund shall be and are hereby declared to be in accordance with law and particularly of Article 4 of Ch. 108-1/2 of the Illinois Revised Statutes and all amendments thereof.

SECTION SEVEN

The Treasurer of the Board of Trustees of the Warrenville Fire Protection District shall be Ex-officio Treasurer and Custodian of the Pension Fund.

SECTION EIGHT

A certified copy of this Ordinance shall be filed with the County Clerk of DuPage County, Illinois, with the annual tax levy ordinance for the year ending \_\_\_\_\_, and a certified copy of this Ordinance shall also be filed with the Department of Insurance of the State of Illinois.

SECTION NINE

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
