Fire Internship partnership with the College of DuPage

Chief Levy updated the Board on the new fire internship program in partnership with the College of DuPage, as well as the District's cadet program. Cadets will now earn college credit, and the internship will span one year across three semesters. Participants must be at least 18 years old. The internship is part of the District's retention strategy, designed to maintain engagement with individuals aged 18–21 who are post-high school but not yet eligible for full-time employment. Lisle-Woodridge Fire District is currently operating a similar program. The internship may also be considered for future full-time hiring preference points.
